086/20 Apologies

Resolved to accept apologies from Cllr G Albion and Cllr C Edmondson.

091/20 Chairs Announcements

The chair welcomed new Cllr P Gibbard-Thompson to the Parish Council.
She also advised that Charter will take place on 1 August but it will be a very scaled down event this year.

092/20 Public Participation.

a) There was no report from the police.

b) The county Cllr was in attendance and reported:

Some high works have been done in last couple of weeks White paint has appeared on A595 at Foxfield so hopefully works will be done soon. The two flashing speed signs at Foxfield that have not worked for years are going to be replaced but probably not like for like perhaps similar to the new SID in Church Street. The two new ones at Foxfield will be the responsibility of Highways and not the parish council or local community. The first round of government funding for walking and cycling will probably not apply to us as it is more towards town centres and schools etc. However, there is a good case for Occupation Lane as it is not acceptable that there is way to get to Foxfield Railway station without going on to the road, another option is to extend the footpath on Foxfield Road. Cumbria has an extra 50 police officers over the next two years some of which have been assigned to communities. Cllr Brereton will try to propose that two are based in Broughton. Cllr Brereton gave an update on the bridges; the lockdown has affected repairs. Cllr Brereton would like to approach the WI regarding the refurbishment and moving of a bench at Foxfield.

- c) District Cllrs T Coward and I Wharton were in attendance.
Cllr T Coward gave an update on SLDC customer connects. New way of working. Services will be available on line, parishes need to promote the service. Anyone who cannot access the service can ask us to report issues for them. We will be in the West locality team.
Green Grants are available from SLDC. Pot of £20,000.00 to share out.
She has linked in with the County Cllr regarding the footpath on Foxfield Road being extended to Bush Green and also asked SLDC to get a contact From CCC in order to get a more collective approach however, this will be a longer term project.
Cllr I Wharton also commented on the SLDC customer connect and how it will devolve down to local areas and will highlight recurring issues.
LDNPA – Aware of bad behaviour such as litter, wild camping is a new trend, lots of raves, attention is focused on worst hit areas. Working with Police, National Trust, Forestry Commission and County Council but it a very complex issue. More resources will be becoming available to deal with the problems.
