## **Broughton Mills, Woodland** & Foxfield

Seventeen members met at the Victory Hall on Wednesday 3 September. Minutes from our August meeting were approved, and

various events and future outings were discussed. As usual we have a busy programme to look forward to in the coming months including celebrating our 80th birthday. We then welcomed our speaker for the evening, Archie Workman, who spoke to us about his 'Life in the Gutter'!

Archie began showing us slides of his childhood in various parts of the country dictated by his parents' work as an immigration officer and an air hostess. He began his own working life in shipyards in the northeast, initially industrially cleaning working parts of ships and then moving on to helping build large diesel engines. He was further promoted to being a sea trials engineer ... testing new ships and often heading out worldwide to help remedy any faults in service. Later, and with a young family at home, he returned to the northeast building and repairing ships and was even involved in the major re-fit of a Russian ship. He was challenged to learn the Russian language to help his necessary visits to the country and very proudly told us he managed to pass a GCSE! In more recent years he moved to Cumbria to initially help start the Regional Development Agency and Ulverston Business Centre to help promote local business and has only very recently retired from the post.

During this busy career he was approached by a parish councillor asking if he would take up the post of Parish Lengthsman ...where he was responsible for the cleaning and upkeep of minor road drains in the 20 square miles surrounding Coniston, Windermere and Greenodd. This work grew to incorporate the cleaning of road signs, repairing of benches and unblocking drains! In 2014 he produced a lighthearted 'Lengthsman's Calendar' which resulted in him being interviewed by BBC Northwest and subsequently appearing on TV shows such as The One Show and Loose Women.

Amazingly he was contacted by a similar group of workers in America and was delighted to be awarded the title of the 'Dullest Man in Britain'! In turn this has led to a book about his work and even a BBC documentary where he was filmed maintaining drain covers around the county. He was proud to tell us that he holds the largest photographic collection of drain covers in the country. This has been on display in Manchester Library and was such a popular exhibit there are initiatives to take it on tour round the country.

What a tale!! Who knew that a talk about drains could be so informative and produce so much laughter?? We all thoroughly enjoyed hearing about Archie's life and work and we agreed that he definitely wasn't the 'Dullest Man in Britain'! He was warmly thanked by Jan Ashworth. Our October meeting will be held in Broughton Mills Reading Room on Wednesday 1 October at 7:30pm when Richard Wilcock will talk to us about Jack the Ripper! Do come and join us...you'll be made very welcome.

Creating wildflower rich

meadows and native woodland

Propagating and sowing wildflowers, spreading existing native tree seed and planting rowan, alder, willow, oak, downy birch and more

Removing non native sitka spruce and rhododendron

Old forestry trees have set seed, and are regenerating fast! This means there are lots of small conifers to remove by hand, using small saws and loppers.

Protecting the new planting areas with fencing and drystone walling Small trees need a bit of extra help to grow above the height where they will be eaten by sheep and deer

#### Improving habitats for insects, birds and mammals

By creating a mosaic of broadleaf native woodland, flower rich meadows, restored mires, upland acid grassland, montane scrub and heathland, we will provide good habitat to boost biodiversity and strengthen populations of threatened species

#### Collecting scientific data for long term monitoring

Citizen scientists (you!) will collect animal and vegetation data - birds, bats, flowers, trees, and mammals. Methods include transects, quadrats, special gadgets and camera traps

## Be part of our volunteering community!

We have regular volunteer days for you to be involved in the restoration of Miterdale. The valley is big, and we rely on as much help from our community as possible! The group meets on the last Saturday of the month and every other Friday to undertake practical conservation work.

# SUSTAINABLE DUDDON News

## MoRPh Survey- 13th September

It was great to see 12 volunteers turn up to carry out the MoRPh 10, despite some seriously unpleasant weather! These surveys allow us to put our area on the national map,

and, importantly, monitor changes over time of the river's physical habitat. We plan to carry out one more survey before the winter, so keep an eye out for information on our Facebook page and local social media. If you'd like further information about this, don't hesitate to get in touch.



#### What does Climate Change mean to you?

This was a question posed to visitors to our stand at the Millom and Broughton Show. At time of writing, strong winds and heavy rain has been battering the country, and certainly weather extremes were one aspect raised by many people. If you want more information about climate change, or to find out details about the various activities you could get involved, please get in touch.



## **BEAT (Barrow to Esk Active Travel)**

The BEAT Route project had a stand at Black Combe Country Fair and Millom and Broughton show at the end of August, and received literally hundreds of supporters. We were pleased that so many completed surveys to help us identify what provisions residents (and a few visitors) would like for getting around without a car: 'traffic free routes' to 'enjoy scenery and fresh air while exercising'. Many also recorded that they felt unsafe even on narrow lanes that are quiet (until a car comes speeding around a blind bend).

We are now analysing over 300 surveys from these shows. The strong support we received helps the project demonstrate demand and gain funding. ## A POST OFFICE FOR BROUGHTON......

Having successfully passed a comprehensive Financial Assessment in August, Broughton Community Service CIC then had to engage in a gruelling two-hour Suitability Assessment interview with Post Office Ltd. On 9th September we received the excellent news that we had met all the criteria to open a post office branch in Broughton! At the time of writing we are awaiting a further on-site meeting to arrange timings for the post office fit-out and for some mandatory training of those working on the post office counter.

It has been an incredibly challenging and time-consuming four months to get to this stage and we are immensely grateful to everyone in our community who has supported and contributed to this endeavour through donations and volunteering their time. Quite a few not-for-profit groups don't succeed in their aim of setting up a community post office or can take years rather than months to do so. As such, we wish to take this opportunity to also acknowledge those who initially got this project off the ground and continue to drive it forward: our three Directors Andrew Gittins, Jackie Lancaster and Emma Hatton, Business Development Manager Annette Carmichael, Treasurer Robert Gathergood, PO & Shop Manager Siobhan Rawlins, PO Operative Ingrid Guy and Lead Volunteer Elaine Knowles. Without their perseverance and hard work Broughton would have lost its post office.

So, with further weeks required to complete PO procedures, Broughton CIC has decided to open its community shop and visitor information service in the Tourist Information Centre premises first, followed by the post office counter as soon as possible afterwards. Currently we plan for the shop to start trading on Saturday 8th November and hope to have the PO services operating sometime in December.

We are still looking to welcome more people to our team of volunteers who will be helping out with the shop and visitor information service and are fundamental to making this whole community project a success. Full training will be given during October/November and the time commitment can be quite minimal - doing a 2-hour stint about once a month is fine! ## MESSAGE FROM OUR MP MICHELLE SCROGHAM

As I'm writing this the weather is making it feel like summer is a distant memory.

And it has been a very busy summer for me with the Parliament recess giving me the opportunity to attend local events, host coffee meetings, visit local organisations, and get out on the doorstep across the constituency.

That included the Millom and Broughton Agricultural Show at the end of August which I went to with husband, Graham, and cocker spaniel, Charlie. Along with enjoying being back among the cows, sheep and horses, I stocked up on pies and cakes, so we were well fed that weekend! I bought some honey made from beehives in Dalton and Ulverston.

I also caught up with local NFU reps and Celia Caulcott, whom I had also seen earlier that month for a tour at Broughton Mills to see their conservation work.

I was also pleased to catch up with those behind the Broughton post office (and letter box) campaign. I've been keen to support the campaign and have been making sure the Royal Mail and Post Office are aware of the concerns of residents.

Many residents have been in touch with me about the proposed location for the new postbox after the old one was sealed at the former Post Office. While I welcome Royal Mail's confirmation that a replacement is due to be installed, like many other people, I have serious concerns about the planned site on Station Road because of safety and accessibility issues, especially during auction days when the area becomes congested. I've urged Royal Mail's senior team to reconsider the placement and instead put the postbox outside the Tourist Information Centre - a location put forward by residents as safer, more accessible, and better suited for the whole community.

I've also been in touch with the Post Office directly, and I'm pleased to say that progress on the new branch is moving in the right direction. While the final details are still being worked through, the necessary steps are underway to establish this important service for Broughton. Many thanks to the local residents who have put so much work into driving this forward.

So, as summer ends I will need to spend more of my time representing your views in Westminster but will continue to hold regular events and meetings to hear from local people.

As always, I want to hear from you. Please contact me with any concerns you might have.

## **Lost Things**

It's come up a lot recently, the topic of losing things.

Over the Summer I lost my handbag, I was convinced I had bought it home, but after a thorough search by the family it was nowhere to be found. Oh, the dread. Where had I left it? Retracing my steps even involved a trip to Brown How car park, the last place I remembered seeing it, all to no avail. Cards, cash, driving licence and Pie Plus card all gone. Then the relief! Before I got home, it had been found hanging on a door handle in a shadowy corner difficult to see even when you knew it was there. Definitely worth a glass of wine in celebration. This relief was nothing compared to the feeling of joy when my four-year-old daughter turned up after she had wandered away in the supermarket for a just few minutes (to be fair I was pretty annoyed with her as well). Jesus often used real life events in order to help people understand truths about God.

The Parable of the Lost sheep has come up in our church services a couple of times recently.

Jesus was often in the company of those that the religious of the time, the Pharisees, would call 'sinners'. They accused him of welcoming these people and eating with them. And it was true. He did. Sinners as far as they were concerned were the unclean, the poor the sick, the undesirables, those that didn't adhere to the religious laws of the time. But these people were important to Jesus because he knew they were important to God. Knowing exactly what the Pharisees were thinking he told them the story of a Shepherd who had a hundred sheep and lost one of them. The Shepherd does not stop searching for this one sheep until he finds it and on finding it his joy is so great that he holds a party with his friends and neighbours, inviting them to share his joy.

The truth is that however worthless we may feel sometimes, inspite of all our failings we are incredibly precious to God. It is part of our humanity to search for meaning and purpose in our lives and for many that involves searching for the truth about God. The good news is that God is already on our case, he's already searching for us, and he revealed himself and his love for us through the life, death and resurrection of his son Jesus Christ.




